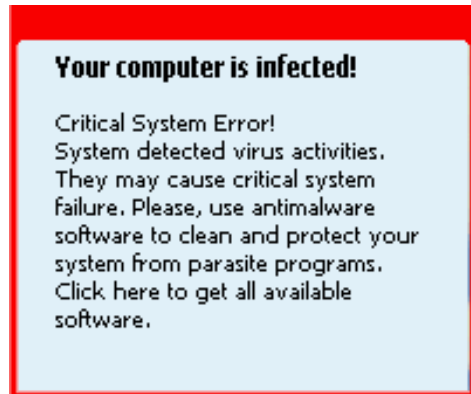
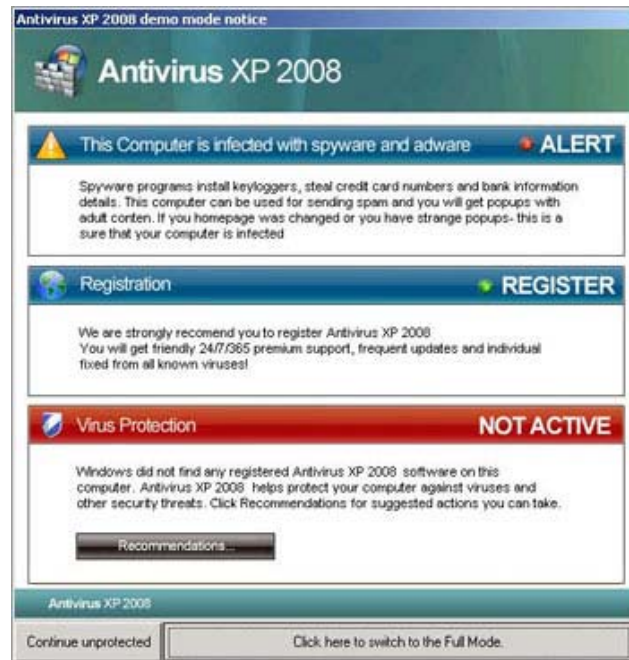


WHAT ARE SOME FAKE WARNINGS AND DISPLAYS: If you click on any part of these messages or icons your computer will be immediately infected.

The FakeVir-O Trojan horse: displays a message, encouraging computer users to visit a website selling software which claims to protect against spyware.



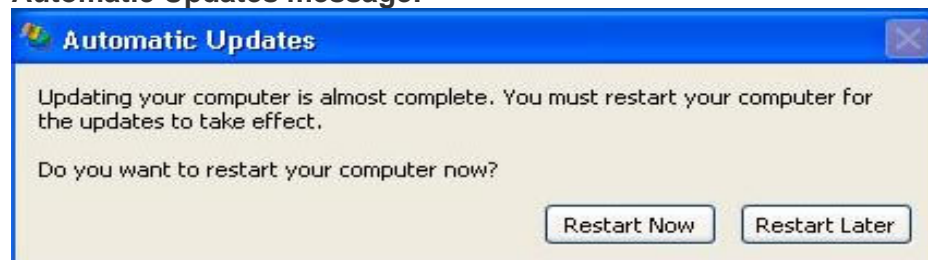
Trojan:Win32/Antivirusxp: Displays a fake Microsoft Windows Security Center (See legitimate example below):



WHAT ARE SOME LEGITIMATE ALERTS AND MESSAGES? : The following are some common messages that will popup occasionally.

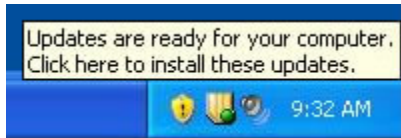

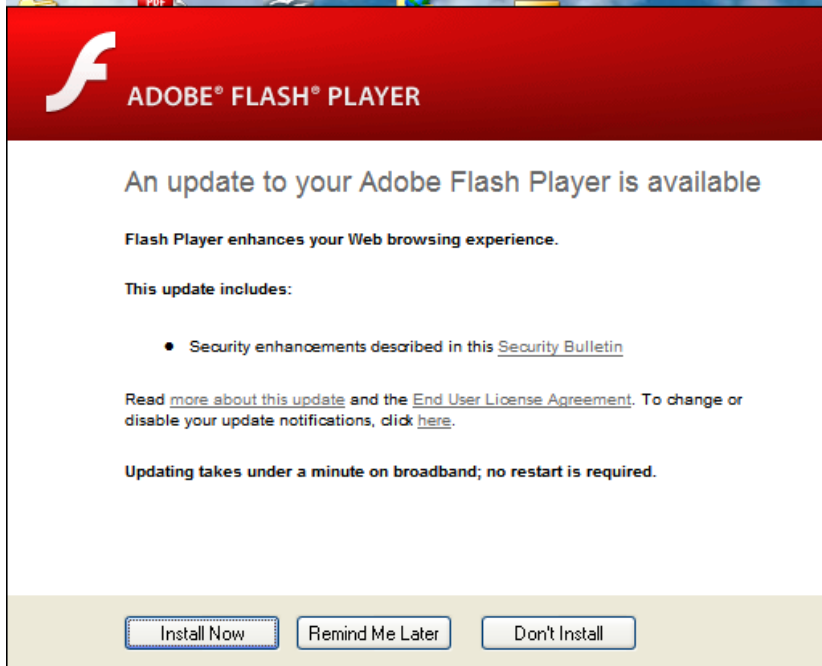


Legitimate display of the Microsoft Windows Security Center:
