INFO: Music and data file sharing software or any instant messenger will routinely install spyware programs and install continuous pop-up spam advertising. They also slow the performance of your computer and could infect your network files.

INFO: Spyware, also known as "AdWare" and "Malware" secretly gathers information about your PC uses and then relays it back to advertisers or hackers. Spyware can infect a computer through a virus or through the installation of new software.

TIP: Delete junk e-mail messages without opening them. Sometimes even opening spam can alert spammers.

TIP: Do not reply to spam unless you are certain that the message comes from a legitimate source. This includes not responding to such messages that offer an option to "Remove me from your list."

REMINDER: Always think twice before clicking links in e-mail or instant messages, even if you know the sender, it could contain a virus.

REMINDER: If you must open any attachment contained in emails, it is a good practice to save it to your hard disk first, and let the antivirus software can check it before opening.

DID YOU KNOW?: Internet criminals often use spam to prey on your desire to help others. If you receive an e-mail request from a charity you would like to support, avoid "donation scams" by calling the organization directly to find out how to contribute.

DID YOU KNOW? If you forward chain, e-mail messages you lose control over who sees your e-mail address and you are probably helping with a hoax and aiding in the delivery of a virus. Plus spammers use chain letters to collect e-mail addresses.
